This may very well turn out to be a November letter before you see it. I usually think of October as being a quiet month, but not this one. I think you will understand why when you hear what I've been up to.

As per usual, there's Care Group on Monday evenings, with working at my church's Foodbank evening as a team on the third Monday of each month. We are studying the Beatitudes. I would never have guessed that we could spend an evening studying one "Blessed are" and learn so much. Not when you are into your 7th decade of a life packed with life experiences. It took a lot of preparation and editing to come up with my finished talk which was about 40 minutes long. Really, all I could do was skim the surface. I enjoyed the chance to share, but am hoping that future opportunities will be of the one-on-one type and informal.

And, finally, there's my current house guest, Miriam, my CanIL colleague with cancer. Miriam completed her chemo regimen, only to be told that her cancer hadn't been touched by it. Plans for radiation were put on hold and she immediately began immunotherapy. A week ago she shared with her CanIL colleagues and other friends that she is no longer up to being alone on this journey and so would welcome staying with someone who could prepare meals for her, do the cleaning and help with her hospital visits. Long story short, I'm that person till mid-November. Miriam will then switch to living with a church friend who has experience caring for a cancer patient. She is planning to be back in Nebraska with family by early December, latest.
